
Present Continuous: to be + V-ing

She/he/it is + Ving
they/you/we are + Ving

he/she/it is not (isn't) + Ving
they/we/you are not (aren't) + Ving

Are they/you/we + Ving
Is he/she/it + Ving
Am I + Ving

Remember

```
You = for one person and many people.

It = for one thing, NOT people (a city = it, a tomato = it).

They = for people and things (cities = they, children = they).
```

Use:

To talk about actions happening now I am writing a report at the moment.

Sam is talking to the manager now.

To describe temporary situations (<u>these days</u>, <u>this week</u>, <u>today</u>)

<u>These days</u> I *am working* overtime.

My son *is not playing* football <u>this week</u>.

Use Present Simple with <u>non-action</u> verbs: like, want, need, prefer, believe, remember, know, understand.

I don't need a motorcycle. Do you want to go shopping now?
